Mr. Lee Leonard reported power is now into the pavilion fuse box. Don Brendel is assisting Lee in the wiring.

Moved by Milton Langmuir to place grade eight rocks on roads in park as needed. Not to exceed 25 - (15 ton loads) price not to exceed \$1.00 a ton. Second by George Schmalz. Motion carried.
